SIGHTS & LANDMARKS

1. Grand Place *Free*

Considered one of the most beautiful medieval squares in Europe, the ornate Grand Place is the center of Brussels where many historic buildings dating from the 17th century are located. Guided tours are regularly arranged inside the City of Brussels Town Hall.

2. Royal Palace of Brussels *Free*

Brussels & Public Transport

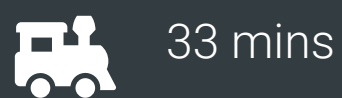
The city centre of Brussels is very accessible by public transport with access to trains, trams, metros, buses and even a waterbus!

Travelers can purchase Brupass XL tickets to use the train, tram, bus and metro across 11.5km and 19 Brussels municipalities with just one ticket

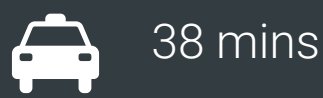
THINGS TO DO

Located in the upscale Sablon neighbourhood, try some traditional and authentic Belgian french fries from this local food truck whilst admiring the Church Chapel in the area.



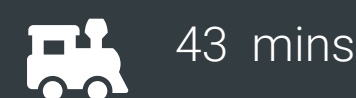
